Diana Allen Kouris

Award winning author of "Riding the Edge of an Era", "Growing Up Cowboy on the Outlaw Trail", and a regional bestseller, "The Romantic and Notorious History of Brown's Park". Diana's western history articles and poetry have been published in magazines, periodicals, including our own Outlaw Trail Journal. Nearing completion is a book about Ann Bassett of Brown's Park known as the "Queen of the Cattle Rustlers." Diana will speak about some of the most compelling historical figures of Brown's Park.

He plans to bring those killings to life using a Power Point slide presentation.

Mark Allen of Spring City, Utah has been performing for over 45 years. He now performs with one of the finest fiddle players in the world, Kelly Roper Iverson. They call their group "Doc and the Lady" Mark is the great, great grandson of Doc (John) Parsons of Brown's Park and the great grandson of Lewis Allen who married Helena Parsons, Doc's daughter. Mark Allen will be speaking on the history of his great grandfathers and the preservation of Doc Parsons Cabin. He and Kelly will also be performing after the dutch oven dinner Friday evening.
